

DO BRING!

- gently used household items for Goodwill
- acids
- aluminum and other metals
- used motor oil filters, antifreeze, and batteries
- transmission and brake fluid
- paint, lighter fluid, solvents and varnish
- pool chemicals
- auto tires (car & light trucks up to 21" - rims removed) limit of 5 per car
- lawn and garden chemicals, herbicides and pesticides
- cleaning products, such as polish, oven cleaner, drain opener and stain remover
- household products labeled "caution" "warning" or "poison"
- brush for recycling
- electronics: computers, printers, cell phones, etc.

DON'T BRING!

- agricultural chemicals
- dioxins
- containers larger than 5 gallons
- medical and pharmaceutical items
- tires with rims attached
- explosives, fireworks or ammunition
- asbestos-containing material
- industrial, commercial or business waste
- radioactive materials (smoke detectors)
- propane cylinders of any kind
- compressed gases

PLEASE KEEP IN MIND...

- Bring products in original containers if possible
- Limit of 5 containers per car
- Separate and group items prior to drop-off and label them
- Go through the line only once
- Properly seal containers to prevent leaking
- Long wait times are possible
- No walkups
- Do not mix or consolidate products
- Please let volunteers help unload your items
- No Trailers longer than 16 feet
- No contractor or business waste
- Haul containers in the back of vehicle and away from passengers



Trim those trees, please



Spring has sprung and so has the tree growth. As lovely as they are, overgrown trees can create vehicle and pedestrian obstruction, which is a safety hazard.

Remember: according to City ordinance, your tree branches should hang:

- At least eight feet above the sidewalk
- No less than 10 feet above the edge of the curb
- At least 14 feet over the street

The City of Cedar Park encourages you to do your own tree trimming so that your trees meet your aesthetic standards. If trees are not trimmed according to the dimensions above, the City may remove encroaching tree branches in order to prevent pedestrian and vehicle obstruction. However, the City can only remove problem branches and will not do any further trimming - which could result in your trees looking a little "lopsided". Help us by doing your part to keep your trees trimmed so that they are not in the way of vehicles or pedestrians.

Many of you may be concerned about your oak trees and oak wilt. All wounding of oaks (including pruning) should be avoided from February through June. 
Trash and Recycling



Oak leaf-dropping season through May

It's that time of year when oak trees in Texas shed their leaves - not to mention all of those pollen pods. You might have already started the raking and bagging. Please remember that leaf and lawn refuse bags count towards your seven item limit of bulk trash outside of

your City of Cedar Park-issued trash cart. If you have more than seven bags or any questions, please contact us through **CP Connect 2.0** or at our Utility Billing Office at 512-401-5300 between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.



BULK TRASH

Trash too big to fit in your bin should be placed on the curb
Up to seven (7) items may be set out for pick up on your regularly scheduled trash day

Accepted

- washers, dryers & stoves
- mattresses & furniture
- refrigerators
 - doors removed
 - refrigerant removed by a licensed technician
- tree & bush clippings
 - must be bundled and tied
 - no greater than 4 feet in length
 - no greater than 4 inches in diameter
 - no more than 50 pounds in weight
- fencing material
 - must have nails removed
 - must be bundled and tied
 - must be no greater than 4 feet in length
 - must be no more than 50 pounds in weight

Not Accepted

- household hazardous waste
- tires
- batteries
- concrete/rocks
- roofing shingles
- ammunition
- explosives
- compressed gasses
- propane tanks
- construction material

Other helpful trash tips


Our trash and recycling crews run a tight schedule in order to better serve our entire community. The crews have a specific amount of space and time to get through their assigned routes, without extra trips to the landfill. Here are some things you can avoid in order to help keep things moving efficiently.



Non-Cedar Park issued trash receptacle



More than seven bulk items



Non-bagged excess items outside of cart



Unbroken-down boxes



Plastic bags inside recycling cart



Tree and brush clippings must be bundled and tied. No greater than four feet in length. No greater than four inches in diameter. No more than 50 pounds in weight.

Recycling



Remember that Styrofoam is not recyclable through the City's single stream recycling program. Pizza boxes and other cardboard boxes for fast food such as fried chicken are also not recyclable because the grease contaminates the paper for recycling. - Grass and weeds over 12 inches in height
- Stagnant water in pools, water features or flower pots
- Accumulations of trash and debris
- Construction debris stored on property and


