We'll also have our Motorcycle Officers out there, some 9-1-1 Dispatchers, Animal Control officers and other first responders.



The September 24, 2020 City Council Meeting transitioned from an all-videoconferencing format to a new hybrid meeting format, with City Council Members and some City staff attending in-person. In the interest of public health and safety, outside consultants, other presenters and the public joined remotely via videoconference.

Council discussed, among other items:

- An Economic Development Agreement Between The Cedar Park Economic Development (Type A) Corporation and Rose City Management, LLC for the purchase and development of four 75,000 to 100,000-square foot office buildings on 13.411 acres just southwest of Cedar Park Town Center

- City of Cedar Park's COVID-19 Declaration of Local State of Disaster
