

Juvenile Community Service

Pursuant to Texas Code of Criminal Procedure § 45.049, community service may be performed at the following types of organizations only:

- A **governmental entity, non-profit organization, or another organization** that provides services to the general public that enhance social welfare and the general well-being of the community as determined by the justice or judge.
- An educational institution
- By attending a tutoring program, work and job skills training program, a preparatory class for the high school equivalency examination administered under Section 7.11, Education Code, or similar activity.

If you wish to perform community service at an agency or organization other than those listed on page 3, YOU MUST CONTACT THE COURT FOR APPROVAL. If you fail to obtain court approval, your hours may be denied. If you have any questions about whether an organization is acceptable, you must contact the court for approval.

The list provided is not comprehensive, and is simply intended to assist you in locating a community service agency. Please read through the list carefully, as each agency may have different requirements, and be aware that all community service hours will be verified by the Court.

Also attached to this notice is the Community Service Time Log. The log **must** reflect each date that community service hours were performed, the name of the organization, a description of the work, the number of hours performed that day, and **must** be signed by the approved supervisor and include the organization's telephone number. If community service is performed at multiple agencies, a separate log will be required.

Those defendants performing community service will be expected to comply with all rules and regulations of the agency where the hours are being performed. Disrespectful behavior or vulgar language will not be tolerated, and appropriate attire must be worn. **Failure to comply with the agency's policies could result in a denial of community service.**

Otherwise, the Juvenile and/or parent must appear at the Cedar Park Municipal Court with photo identification to obtain further information about their case, OR submit a signed (manually or electronically by typing your full name) request and photo identification.

Juvenile Community Service Provider / Job Descriptions

Lifelong Friends Pet Adoption

Clean litter boxes, kennels and other duties assigned. Must sign up for 2 or more hours per day.

Travis County Rural Community Centers:

Organizing the clothing closet/food pantry, and making food packages for families, and picking up trash inside and outside of the agency. *Must be mature and able to work independently with little supervision.

Williamson Co. Animal Shelter:

Work is assigned each day by staff including cleaning kennels/ yards, doing laundry and/or dish duties.

Habitat for Humanity Restore:

Work will include customer service (selling, answering questions, helping customer load product onto carts), pricing, stocking and organizing merchandise, cleaning and answering the phones.

Creative Action Project

Data Entry, administrative duties such as filing and sorting, prep work for in the classroom programming (making bracelets, booklets, etc.).

Central Austin Youth League:

Duties will consist of grounds keeping activities such as picking up trash around the park.

Goodwill Industries of Central Texas

Ages 16 and older have the option of working in the Goodwill retail stores or on a service project.

Open My World Therapeutic Riding Center

Work will involve grounds keeping, painting, fence repairs and raking leaves. Ages 13 and under may work with the petting zoo animals. Ages 15 and older may be asked to help with direct care of horses.

Neighborhood Sports

Work will involve picking up trash, working with soccer leagues and a variety of misc. work.

Life Steps

Work will consist of janitorial duties.
